The Iowa Mentoring Partnership is a collaboration between the Iowa Department of Education, the Iowa School for the Deaf, the Iowa State Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf, the Interpreter Training Programs at Kirkwood Community College, Scott Community College, and Iowa Western Community College, and the Deaf Services Commission of Iowa, Iowa Department of Human Rights.

The goal of this partnership is to increase the number of licensed by examination sign language interpreters in the state of Iowa and provide continuing education opportunities for all sign language interpreters. The Iowa Mentoring Partnership has been providing trainings via ICN across Iowa and co-sponsoring other trainings to expand access to quality continuing education for all sign language interpreters in Iowa.

Lynne Wiesman (formerly Eighinger), MBA, CI/CT, SC:L, Master Mentor

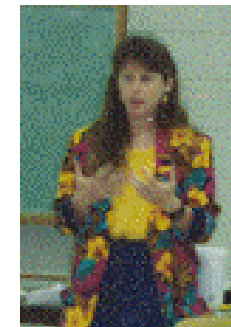

Rayni has a degree in Communication Studies from Gallaudet University and is the coordinator of the Nebraska Mentoring Program. She was Nebraska's first state-licensed intermediary interpreter. She conducts sign competency interviews and has provided mentoring and training to mentors and mentees statewide. She is also certified from NCOD (national center on deafness) to provide training on the Roles, Rights & Responsibilities of interpreters and students in educational settings.



“Meta-Mentoring”

This workshop will prepare previously trained Mentors to become Meta-Mentors. The focus of this will be to assist them in applying the mentoring skills toward mentoring of the newly trained mentors. This seminar will review “mentoring” and its critical components for interpreters. **In order to participate, the full session must be attended.**

The goals of this workshop include:

- To define meta-mentoring
- To distinguish between meta mentoring for demonstration purposes and for actual mentoring of mentors
- To apply mentoring skills to Meta-Mentoring during the Mentor the Mentor Training
- To establish a structure for the support of the newly trained Mentors as they provide mentoring during the training and for the next 6 months post training
- To demonstrate a ‘live’ session of a meta-mentoring during the mentor/mentee relationship and observing the process between the mentor and men-

This training is open only to those individuals who attended Phase I Mentor training in March of 2006 in Des Moines, Iowa.
